

## Instruction for Authors

### Title page

The title page should include:

- The name(s) of the author(s)
- A concise and informative title, **No abbreviation in the title.**
- Running title: 40 characters long including spaces.
- The affiliation(s) and address(es) of the author(s)
- The e-mail address, and telephone number(s) of the corresponding author
- If available, the 16-digit ORCID of the author(s)

### Abstract

Do not use citation to references in the abstract.

For original articles the structure of abstract is as follows

- Purpose (stating the main purposes and research question)
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusions

For other types of articles (e.g. Short communication, Brief report, Case report, ...) a nonstructural abstract is necessary.

Word count for abstract in original articles  $\leq 250$  and  $\geq 200$  and in other types of articles (e.g. Short communication, Brief report, Case report, ...)  $100 \leq$  and  $150 \leq$ .

### Keywords

Please provide 4 to 6 keywords which can be used for indexing purposes. Please use MeSH terms, Minimum three keywords needed.

### Text

## **Text Formatting**

Manuscripts should be submitted in Word.

- Use a normal, plain font (e.g., 10-point Times Roman) for text.
- Use italics for emphasis.
- Use the automatic page numbering function to number the pages.
- Do not use field functions.
- Use tab stops or other commands for indents, not the space bar.
- Use the table function, not spreadsheets, to make tables.
- Use the equation editor or MathType for equations.
- Save your file in docx format (Word 2007 or higher) or doc format (older Word versions).

## **Headings**

Please use no more than three levels of displayed headings.

## **Abbreviations**

Abbreviations should be defined at first mention and used consistently thereafter.

## **Footnotes**

Footnotes can be used to give additional information, which may include the citation of a reference included in the reference list. They should not consist solely of a reference citation, and they should never include the bibliographic details of a reference. They should also not contain any figures or tables.

Footnotes to the text are numbered consecutively; those to tables should be indicated by superscript lower-case letters (or asterisks for significance values and other statistical data). Footnotes to the title or the authors of the article are not given reference symbols.

Always use footnotes instead of endnotes.

## **For original articles:**

The original article should be divided into the following sections:

### **Introduction**

Citation to references, tables, figures should appear sequentially, use superscript to cite references. Cite tables and figures in parenthesis.

### **Methods**

Citation to references, tables, figures should appear sequentially use superscript to cite references. Cite tables and figures in parenthesis.

## Results

Citation to references, tables, figures should appear sequentially.

## Discussion

Citation to references, tables, figures should appear sequentially, use superscript to cite references and cite after punctuation marks. Cite tables and figures in parenthesis.

## Conflict of interest

Authors must disclose all relationships or interests that could have direct or potential influence or impart bias on the work. Although an author may not feel there is any conflict, disclosure of relationships and interests provides a more complete and transparent process, leading to an accurate and objective assessment of the work.

## Acknowledgments

Acknowledgments of people, grants, funds, etc. should be placed in a separate section on the title page. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.

## References

All submitted manuscripts should be in the style of Vancouver Reference System for all formats of references. These should be numbered sequentially in order of their appearance in the text and listed in a separate section following the text.

## Tables

- All tables are to be numbered.
- Tables should always be cited in text in consecutive numerical order.
- For each table, please supply a table caption (title) explaining the components of the table.
- Identify any previously published material by giving the original source in the form of a reference at the end of the table caption.
- Footnotes to tables should be indicated by superscript lower-case letters (or asterisks for significance values and other statistical data) and included beneath the table body.

## Charts

Charts should be prepared using such tools as MS-Graph or OpenOffice and be embedded in the main submission file. Charts must not be pasted as scanned images. Legend for charts under the charts.

## Figure Numbering

- All figures are to be numbered.
- Figures should always be cited in text in consecutive numerical order (Figure 1, Figure 2, ...).
- Figure parts should be denoted by letters (A, B, C, etc.).
- If an appendix appears in your article and it contains one or more figures, continue the consecutive numbering of the main text. Do not number the appendix figures, "A1, A2, A3, etc." Figures in online appendices (Electronic Supplementary Material) should, however, be numbered separately.

### Figure Captions

- Each figure should have a concise caption describing accurately what the figure depicts. Include the captions in the text file of the manuscript, not in the figure file.
- Figure captions begin with the term Figure., followed by the figure number.
- No punctuation is to be included after the number, nor is any punctuation to be placed at the end of the caption.
- Identify all elements found in the figure in the figure caption; and use boxes, circles, etc., as coordinate points in graphs.
- Identify previously published material by giving the original source in the form of a reference citation at the end of the figure caption.
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### Figure Placement

Other than bar charts and related graphs, all other kinds of graphics including digital pictures, scanned images must be submitted as supplementary files. Submit each picture as a separate graphic file. Upon acceptance of manuscript high quality images as specified by Pubmed Central at:

are needed. It is the responsibility of the authors to prepare and send the required graphic file formats in time, otherwise the publication of the paper will be delayed.

### Plagiarism prevention with CrossCheck

JMSS is a participant of CrossCheck, a multi-publisher plagiarism detection initiative to screen published and submitted content for originality. Results returned by the software may be used as a criterion for the analysis of the manuscript by the editorial board and may eventually result in a rejection due to plagiarism, duplicate and/or redundant publication.

### Double-Blind Peer Review

This journal uses double-blind review, which means that both the reviewer and author identities are concealed from the reviewers, and vice versa, throughout the review process. Submit the Title Page containing the Authors details and Blinded Manuscript with no author details as 2 separate files.
